#### Announcements:

*-Extension of Order #59:* Limited capacity to 25% was meant to end 1/10, now extended to 1/24. No new rules, just extended.

-*Liability Protections*: "Health care services" provided by a health care facility or health care professional, regardless of location, that involves the treatment, diagnosis, prevention or mitigation of COVID-19. Health care professionals and health care services shall be immune from suit and civil liability for any damages sustained in the course of providing health care services during the period of COVID-19. No need for additional action by municipalities to certify coverage. MAHB will put together a one-pager about

-COVID-19 variant: B117, the variant ID'ed in the UK. Does transmit more readily, but does not seem to be more severe. ID'ed in at least 7 states to date, including NY and CT. Massachusetts also doing surveillance but hasn't been ID'ed in Massachusetts, yet.

Q: Can testing being done right now test for the new variant?

**A**: Yes. It will pick it up, but it will sequence the sample differently which is indicative of the variant. There are some questions about the monoclonal antibody treatment, but not much about the ability for the test to pick up on the virus.

-CTC: Receiving about 5k cases/day. Leads to having about 1 days' worth of cases that have fallen a bit behind. We haven't reached about 1k of these cases within the 24 hour timeframe that we like to follow. Over the weekend high staffing levels and successful outreach during the weekend, confident we'll be able to clear some of these backlogs.

-Vaccine Phases/Priority Group: Webpage updated Tuesdays and Thursdays at 5:00 pm. School nurses, considered in 1<sup>st</sup> priority, if, and only if, they are doing testing sites (BinaxNOW testing) and/or also working in a vaccination clinic. School nurses on their own are not considered first priority. If

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they're working with students regularly, and are not vaccinating or testing, they are in a different category.

Also, harbor masters are going to be added to first responder list. -Vaccine Planning: <u>https://www.mass.gov/info-details/covid-19-vaccine-locations-for-first-</u> responders. Areas with green stars are high-throughput clinics (mass vaccination). Circles are about a 30 mile radius.

-*Vaccine specific clinical comments*: You do not need to wait 90 days if you had COVID-19. You must receive 2 shots in order to be fully vaccinated. If you have recently received the flu shot, you must wait 14 days to get the COVID-19 vaccine. Most common side effects include pain at the injection site, fatigue, joint pain and headache. Vaccines not approved for children at this time.

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Vaccine Planning Long Game: Mass vaccination sites currently being set up are being planned to stay there until the end of Phase 3. Feedback received was that planning was too "choppy" for all the phases. As we move through the phases, the population sizes get bigger, and it's extremely difficult to adjust to every single group across the Commonwealth. Who is interested, and able, to do local clinics as part of a plan going forward? Lots of positive response yesterday. DPH will help you with logistics along the way, i.e. PrepMod, ordering vaccine. We acknowledge that if you do this, there are some things that will need to be put to the side. Maybe this means you push contact tracing work out to the CTC.

*Vaccine Allocation*: Survey link will be sent to vaccine recipients points of contacts on the 11<sup>th</sup>. It will contain a series of questions about how many have you vaccinated in the priority groups and how much more do you need to complete the priority group? We will be using this as a mechanism to know if you need additional vaccine. Please respond by Tuesday morning/noon as this allows us the opportunity to look at the information for the future. If you have extra doses and want to go out of the phase you are vaccinating in, try to look back on the previous priority group, but if you are done with them, you can move on to the next bullet. The optics of this are challenging. If you go way out of the priority group there is a lot of attention on who is being vaccinated and this can cause problems politically.
