Intern U.S. Home Locations













Retail Food Safety Regulatory Association Collaborative (the Collaborative)

- NEHA, AFDO, ASTHO, CFP, NACCHO, CDC, and FDA have worked to create and share tools and resources food safety programs (for regulators and retail food establishments). Our 6 objectives are:
 - Develop a strategy to support national Food Code adoption.
 - Increase use of risk-based inspections and intervention strategies.
 - Increase use of FDA's Voluntary National Retail Food Regulatory Program Standards.
 - Improve foodborne outbreak investigation methods.
 - Increase the number of restaurants and other retail food establishments with well-developed food safety management systems that use active managerial control.
 - Develop a strategy to enhance communication and better tell our collective story.



Retail Flexible Funding Model Cooperative Agreement



Objective 1: Subawards

- Year 2 Grants have been awarded
- Year 2 Grants run from Jan 1-Dec 31
- 477 total grants were awarded across all grant categories worth approximately \$7.5M
- SLTT Unique Jurisdictions Receiving Funding:
 - 31 State
 - 193 Local
 - 3 Tribal
 - 3 Territorial

Objective 2: Training Needs Assessment

- A training needs survey was developed and issued.
- The survey was open for approximately 6 months and collected a significant amount of data from both individuals and jurisdictions.
- An update was presented at the NEHA AEC in New Orleans.
- A final report will be issued when the analysis is complete.
